Intially Alyssa appeared to be behind in her social skills. She was not able to play independently or with her sister without fighting or arguing over sharing a toy. Alyssa has since improved a great deal socially and has started to voice her feelings.

Alyssa does not have any family members that play an active role in her life. Upon initially being placed into care Alyssa went to her maternal grandparents home. However, she and her sister were removed due to innapropriate behavior on the part of the grandparents. Alyssa and her sister then went to live with their maternal uncle, however the uncle requested the children be removed due to them being undisciplined and his inability to control them.

Alyssa does have a significant bond to her foster mother.

ALYSSA IS A 6-YEAR-OLD CAUCASION FEMALE. SHE HAS BLUE EYES AND BROWN HAIR. SHE IS APPROX. 44 INCHES TALL AND WEIGHS 45 POUNDS.

During this report period Alyssa remains in her foster care placement with her sister. There have been no replacements.

Alyssa is a six year old Caucasian female. She has long brown hair, blue eyes and wears glasses. Physically Alyssa appears to be of average height and weight for her age. She weighs 40 pounds and is 42 3/4 inches tall. Alyssa has no known medical conditions, allergies, or illnesses. Presently she is taking a daily multivitamin and Poly Vi-Flor. This report period, Alyssa was seen by Dr. Alt through Community Mental Health. She was prescribed a small dose of Prozac to aid with her anxiety. Since being prescribed medication Alyssa's behavior and over all emotional health has improved significantly. She is still receiving services through Infant Mental Health as well.

Alyssa will be in the first grade this coming fall. She will continue to attend Grant Primary Center pending the outcome of adoption. The school year ended on June 9, 2006. She received very postive marks from her Kindergarten teachers.

Alyssa's hobbies and interests include watching movies, reading, swimming and coloring. She continues to thrive in her current placement.

Keast Amber

AMBER IS A THREE YEAR OLD CAUCASION FEMALE. SHE HAS HAZEL EYES AND BROWN HAIR. PHYSICALLY, SHE APPEARS OF AVERAGE HEIGHT AND WEIGHT FOR HER AGE. Amber is a three and a half year old Caucasian female. She has short brown hair, and hazel eyes. Physically Amber appears to be of average height and weight for her age. She weighs 35 pounds and is 38 inches tall. Amber has asthma. Amber's last physical was on August 11, 2005. Her immunizations are up to date. This report period Amber was prescribed medication to aid in treating ADHD. She has shown signicant improvement in her behavior. She continues to receive infant mental health services.

Have efforts made to obtain a placement with relatives been pursued? - Yes

The children were originally placed with their maternal grandparents. However they were removed after the grandfather admitted to smoking marijuana as well as did not follow through with the visitation agreement. The children were then placed with their maternal uncle, however he requested they be removed after a week in placement because he could not control their behavior.

f. Reasons why it is not in the child's best interest to be placed for adoption or within the kinship network:

It is in the best interest for the children to remain out of the parental home. The conditions that caused the removal have not been rectified.
